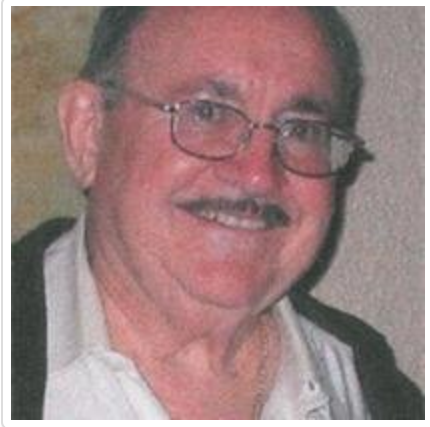




Robert Alexander Carothers
